### Meet a Co-Hort: Kyle Poppens

**Kyle Poppens** owns and operates Poppens Produce in Parkersburg, Iowa. In addition to farming 4,000 acres of row crops with his family, Kyle grows specialty crops on his farm, including many types of fruit and vegetables, which he sells through Facebook. With a degree in agronomy and a minor in horticulture, Kyle says he has “an overzealous green thumb” with interests that range from orchids to honeyberries to yellow multiplier onions and many things in between.

**Why do you grow horticultural crops, in 5 or fewer words?:** I love growing plants!

**What is something you're excited about trying?:** We're trying blackberries in our greenhouse! We are expanding our 35-by-70-foot greenhouse to be about 90 feet long, and we're adding more blackberries. They have just taken off in there and are nearly 20 feet tall, so we're looking to add more.

**What is one thing you would change about your industry?:** That's kind of hard to answer, but I'm really interested in growing the horticulture side of our business, but the barrier to doing that is time, followed by labor.

**Favorite PFI memory:** Connecting with **Jeff Sindelar** about honeyberries. He is a wealth of knowledge. I learned more from talking with him than from all the research I did on my own.

**Your favorite crop and why:** Probably blackberries. It's like I'm growing dessert!

## Grant opportunity in Johnson County




**[The Johnson County Community Food and Farm Grant Program](#)** is accepting applications until Oct. 27.
