Video: "Cereal Rye for Cover Crop Seed Opens the Door to a Diverse Rotation"

In this week's "Practical Cover Croppers" video, farmers **Rachel and Alec Amundson** of Osage, Iowa, share how they're raising cereal rye to meet increased demand in the Midwest.

They also discuss how raising rye seed locally can help make distribution easier and reduce the risk of importing weed seeds.

"As the demand for cover crops in the state of Iowa increases, we're going to need more people growing rye," Rachel says. "There's no way we can cover the acres we need to, to address our water quality issues, with such a limited supply."

"We need to have the access close, and we need to have timely access, to be able to apply those cover crops in the fall."

Results from year five of cereal rye variety trials



The latest results of our ongoing "Cereal Rye and Triticale Variety Trial" are now in.

The project, carried out at Iowa State University research farms across the state over the past five years, aims to test how a range of varieties grow in different conditions. This year, we trialed 11 cereal rye varieties and one winter triticale variety.
