Caring for livestock in the cold

The snow is finally here! Next, it seems, comes the cold. While snow is welcome moisture and an insulating layer on the soil, the cold has fewer upsides. While braving the cold enables pride and bragging rights, outdoor livestock can't retreat to a warm house; they require extra attention as the temperature plunges. Cold animals use more energy to warm themselves up, so feed requirements go accordingly. It's also harder to make skinny animals gain weight, the energy loss can be a vicious cycle.
