
PFI: What advice would you give to other beginning farmers hoping to make changes to their family's generational farm?

Todd: Learn to balance and appreciate the context of where the previous generations are coming from. Balance your newfound excitement to try new things against the values and practices that have been in place for decades.

Look for ways to get them involved in the learning that feel manageable and less scary. You may not get to convert the full 100 acres into no-till, but you might be able to convince them to test it on one acre.
