Meet Trent and Mitch of BA Family Farms



Trent Butler and Mitch Anderson are in their second year owning and operating **BA Family Farms**, a 5-acre farm in Indianola where they raise pastured poultry for meat and eggs, bees and produce with a focus on regenerative agriculture. They've also expanded their operation to include value-added products like baked goods and preserves. They sell their farm products directly to consumers at the Indianola Downtown Farmers Market and the Indianola Fairgrounds Farmers Market.

PFI asked: What was your first step in finding your customer base?

Trent and Mitch: "The first step was knowing our personal strengths. We're good with in-person communication and savvy with technology. We get to utilize our in-person communication as a vendor at our local farmers market.

There, we have open conversations with folks about where their food came from and the benefits our farm offers.

We also post about our farm on local group's social media channels. After we established some interest, we mostly used social media to communicate with our customers. It's been a free way to keep folks up to date with when our birds will be available, any in-person markets we'll be selling, past customer reviews, and more


Through the PFI network, farmers are connecting and finding support as they build resilient farms.
