Making way for cover crops in 60-inch corn rows

Planting corn in wider rows spaced 60 inches apart, as opposed to the typical 30-inch rows, provides a unique opportunity to grow cover crops while simultaneously growing a cash crop.

David Dedert of Quincy, Illinois, grows row crops and raises beef cattle, calves and sheep. While he has grazed cover crops for the past two decades, he was intrigued when he learned from eastern Iowa farmers **Bob Recker and Eric Miller**

about planting cover crops in the wider 60-inch space between corn rows. David decided to trial it on his farm in 2023.

"I liked the idea of being able to raise a decent stand of corn crop and then also be able to graze the cover crops in the fall afterward," he says.
