Looking at the financial savings behind cover crops at the Amundsons' farm in Osage

Rachel and Alec Amundson of Osage, Iowa, often frost-seed red clover on their oat and cereal rye seed production ground.

<u>In this video filmed in 2021</u>, you'll learn how using red clover and other cover crops have increased financial resilience to fluctuating nitrogen fertilizer prices.

"On a year like this when nitrogen costs have gone through the roof, and we're not sure how much we'll actually be able to get, and what the price is going to be, the fact that we can use 50, 60, 70 pounds [nitrogen per acre] less and raise just as good of a crop as everyone else is just money in our pocket," says Alec.
