Meet a CoHort: Michael and Deb Carter

Michael and Deb Carter own Hidden Acres Farm in Coon Rapids, Iowa, where they grow diverse vegetables and cut flowers that they sell at four weekly farmers markets.

Why do you grow hort crops, in five or fewer words: We love working with our hands.

What is something you're excited about this year: We always get excited about trying to anticipate the needs of our customers and growing what they want to buy. We put so much work into what we grow that we want to be able to sell all of it and understanding what customers want helps us sell more. Even packaging crops differently – like putting cucumbers in baskets for pickling instead of selling them individually – can get more of them sold at the market. It's fun.

What is one thing you would change about your industry: We are interested in letting people – especially the younger generations – know that you can make a living and have a fulfilling life on a farm doing something other than corn and soybeans. We want to mentor folks and help them succeed. Also, having canneries back in the state to have a market and a way of preserving the harvest would make a huge difference.

Favorite PFI memory: Meeting **Jan Libbey.** We went to a field day on her farm and saw how she set up her wash-pack area. It was simple, but we learned so much from it. It was so positive and made it seem possible.

Your favorite crop and why: It's cucumbers. We had such a huge crop this year that we laughed about it.

PFI offers a cost-share program for specialty crop farmers seeking to make on-farm food safety improvements. Participants must spend at least \$2,200 on improvements and will receive a \$2,000 reimbursement.
