

Choose Iowa Value-Added Grant

- \$463,000 available in funding
- Increase sales of Iowa agricultural products by increasing production capacity or expanding market access for value-added projects
- Unique: Individual orgs can also apply
- ≤\$25,000 award amount
- Cost-share, 1:1 match
- Reimbursement <u>after</u> project completion

Note: Membership not necessary to apply for the Choose Iowa Value-Added Grant





Choose Iowa Value-Added Grant: Projects MUST

- Increase sales of Iowa agricultural products by increasing production capacity or expanding market access for value-added projects
- Not be in progress until a grant is awarded
- Be completed in 12 months or less
- Be conducted in Iowa





Choose Iowa Value-Added Grant Timeline:

- Dec. 2, 2024: Application period opened
- Jan. 31, 2025 <u>at noon</u>: Application period closes
- March 2025: Recipients contacted, agreements finalized
- April 2025: Recipients announced

Choose Iowa Dairy Innovation Grant

- \$750,000 in funding
- Max of \$100,000 per grant awardee
 - Producer must be able to provide a 1:1 match for the grant
 - Additional points awarded for more than required match amount
 - In-kind contributions not accepted
- On-farm dairy processing equipment, labor-reducing technology or BOTH

Choose Iowa Dairy Innovation Grant

Timing:

- October 2024: Application period opened
- November 27 <u>at noon</u>: Application deadline
- Dec./Jan. 2025: Applications scored by committee
- March 2025: Awardees announced

Choose Iowa Butchery Innovation Grant

- NEW! Will be announced in January 2025
- \$250,000 in funding
- Max of \$100,000 per grant awardee, no minimum amount
 - Processor must be able to provide a 1:1 match for the grant
 - In-kind contributions not accepted
- Butchery and meat processing equipment

Note: Membership not necessary to apply for the Choose Iowa Butchery Innovation Grant





Choose Iowa Butchery Innovation Grant

Timing:

- January 2025: Pre-application review with CIRAS begins
- February 2025: Application period opens
- 3rd week Feb. 2025: pre-application review closes
- March 31, 2025 <u>at noon</u>: Application deadline
- April 2025: Applications scored by committee
- May 2025: Awardees announced

Choose Iowa Food Purchasing Pilot

• NEW!

- \$225,000 allocated to food banks (announced July 2024)
 - 6 food banks + DMARC participating initially
- \$70,000 allocated for Schools (will be announced soon 2025)
 - School pilot application period opens in January
 - \$1,000 per school/building/district
- Purchases eligible from Choose Iowa members only

Note: Choose Iowa Membership REQUIRED





Choose Iowa: Distinctions

BRAND

- Iowa grown, raised or made food, beverages and ag products
- Add logo on qualifying products that meet/exceed min. criteria
- Annual membership dues
- Expanding beyond food to include more Iowa ag products (horticulture, natural fibers)
- Choose Iowa Passport, events:
 - Farm Store Crawl, Farm Open House

GRANTS

- Value-added agriculture OR Dairy innovation OR Butchery innovation
- Membership NOT required
- Up to \$25,000 (value-added), \$100,000 (dairy, butchery), \$1,000 (schools) or (TBD) food banks

- Grant funds are paid out as a reimbursement after grant project(s) are completed.
- Projects cannot be in progress before a grant is awarded and must be able to be completed in 12 months or less.

- What is a Specialty Crop?
 - Fruits and vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture, and nursery crops (including floriculture)

- Who is eligible to apply?
 - Iowa agencies, universities, institutions, and producer, industry, and community-based organizations.
 - Single organizations, and individuals are encouraged to participate as project partners.
 - Applicants must reside, and/or conduct their business in Iowa.
 - Must be a legal entity with a UEI number and have the legal capacity to contract.





IDALS Details:

- Funding around \$350,000 typically
 - (last year \$368,627.98)
- Projects can be up to \$30,000
- ~14 applications approved per year

Projects include:

- High tunnel
- Shared kitchen
- Green house
- Christmas trees
- Marketing
- Hazelnuts

- Wine
- Perennial grasses
- Food hubs
- Fruits/vegetables
- No-Till
- Farm to School
