BEGINNING FARMER RESOURCES

Emergency funding available for regenerative farmers



Healing Soils Foundation is launching the **Regenerative Farmer Assurance Fund** to provide critical financial relief to organic and regenerative farmers facing delays in public funding.

Farmers are eligible for up to \$50,000. Funds are distributed as available in a rolling application format and farmers reimburse the fund if and when their delayed public funding is received.

Brighter Future Fund's Emergency Resilience Grant



The American Farmland Trust Brighter Future Fund's Emergency Resilience Grant is to offset financial disruptions farmers and ranchers are experiencing due to natural disasters, such as flooding, wildfires or avian flu; the loss or delay of funding due to the government funding freeze; or a loss of markets.

Funding will be prioritized for small to mid-size farms facing challenges accessing funding opportunities.

Root and Bloom Fellowship applications due May 14



The Root and Bloom Fellowship is an advocacy and power-building educational opportunity for farmers from Young Farmers Coalition.

Fellows will explore how challenges young and BIPOC farmers face nationwide are rooted in federal agriculture policy and how those policies and power dynamics play out in their communities. They'll also learn about how to make change at home.
