Meet beginning farmers, Paul and Miriam

Paul and Miriam Skrade own and operate **Driftless Rock Farm**, a 5-acre farm in northeast Iowa they began in 2023. They have a targeted goat grazing business and raise Buff Orpington chickens for eggs and meat that they sell off their farm directly to consumers.

PFI asked Paul and Miriam: How did you know when the right time to start farming was for you?

Paul: The stars aligned, and we knew it was the right time. Our kids graduated from high school and went to college. Then a property within biking distance of my work became available. We were raising chickens in the backyard but thought this was the right opportunity to scale up.

Miriam: We had an empty nest and started to fill it with goats and chickens! We also knew we had great support through our network at Upper Iowa University. We were in a place where we knew we had plenty of people and community to turn to as we learned and continued to ask questions.

Is a USDA Value-Added Producer Grant right for you?



The Value-Added Producer Grant program helps fund agricultural producers' value-added activities to generate new products, create and expand marketing opportunities and increase producer income.

There is approximately \$30 million in total available funding and maximum grant amounts are \$75,000 for planning grants and \$250,000 for working capital grants.

Enroll in the Iowa Valley RC&D's no-till cost-share program



Iowa Valley RC&D's 2025 no-till costshare program application is open now.

Like any new practice, using no-till for vegetable production has a learning curve with potentially reduced productivity.

To help with the financial risk, Iowa Valley RC&D is offering up to a \$500 cost-share to 10 Iowa vegetable growers to trial a no-till practice on their farm. Learn more and apply by April 1, 2025.
