# Video: "Winter Wheat and Benefits of Manure Injection Before Corn"



**Kevin Prevo** of Bloomfield, Iowa, takes a whole-farm approach to his soil health management.

With 10 years of experience in no-till production using cover crops, Kevin has found systems that work for his operation. In this "Practical Cover Croppers" video, he shares how he plants winter wheat in twin rows and injects hog manure in the 20-inch gaps, later planting corn where the manure was applied.
