Research report: "Biochar Seed Treatment for Corn"



Biochar, a fine-grain charcoal material produced by heating organic materials to a high temperature in the absence of oxygen, has been gaining popularity over the last decade as a soil amendment and seed inoculant.

Jack Boyer, Robert Harvey and Rob Stout decided to test how using EarthBrew, a biochar product, as a seed coat affected corn yields.


Video: "Establishing On-Farm Habitat for Beneficial Insects"
