### Growing our impact together: PFI's 2024 annual report

As we reflect on our work and growth last year, we celebrate the accomplishments of our farmers, staff and supporters. Our **2024 annual report**, now available

online, shows what we did together – and how these groups are the heart of our work equipping farmers to build resilient farms and communities.

### Here are a few highlights from the report:

- PFI's farmer-led education department stewarded 247 events.
- During our field day season, 66 farms opened their gates to 2,725 attendees, where 98% of attendees say they increased their knowledge.
- Across Iowa, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Illinois, 67 farmers completed 100 research trials.
- Our farm viability team supported **2,387 farmers** who planted **839,484** acres of cover crops.
- Our membership grew to 9,152, including 204 lifetime members.

# Deadline extended: Enroll in a nitrogen reduction research trial by March 31



Reducing your reliance on nitrogen fertilizer can help improve water quality, reduce agriculture's carbon footprint and **improve your farm's bottom line.** 

For this research trial, you will compare two nitrogen fertilizer rates applied to corn in a replicated strip trial. One rate will be your typical nitrogen rate; the other will be a reduced rate of your choosing.

The new deadline to enroll in this trial is March 31.

# Research: "Growing Tomatoes for Sale vs. Seed"




For horticulture farmers, growing crops for their seeds can be a way to diversify enterprises and try something new.

In their 2024 trial, farmers **Hannah Breckbill and Emily Fagan** compared the enterprise budgets of growing tomatoes for food sales verses growing tomatoes to fill a seed contract.

Emily noted that participating in this trial was key for their farm in figuring out the financials of growing tomato seed for contract. See their results.

# Magazine article: "Bridging the Gap"




Openness, trust and respect have been the key to sustaining thriving multigenerational operations for two PFI farm families.
