

Research trial: "Strip-Till Versus No-Till Following Cover Crops"



Many farmers use strip-till or no-till methods to plant corn and soybean crops to reduce soil disturbance, minimize planting costs and plant green into standing cover crops.

In 2024, farmers **Landon Brown and Keaton Krueger** looked at how striptill versus no-till planting affected their crop yields using replicated trials.

Landon hoped to use the trial data to back a potential decision to quit striptilling his corn. Keaton had a similar desire for soybean production. Read the full research report.
