PFI farmers are using multi-year research to improve profitability and decrease nitrogen use

According to farmer **Alec Amundson**, "Nitrogen is a moving target. It is always good to test and adjust." Through PFI's research program, farmers have been working to find out if they can reduce nitrogen rates in their corn while staying

profitable and reaping the economic and environmental benefits of fertilizer reduction.

In 2024, the third year of this trial, 19 farmers in Iowa, Minnesota and Illinois performed 22 replicated strip trials testing their typical nitrogen rate against a reduced rate of their choosing.

The trial is set to continue in 2025. Participant **Don Putz** emphasizes, "We will be running this same scenario for at least two more years to get a clearer picture of the results." <u>See what they've found so far.</u> If you are curious about reducing your nitrogen rate this growing season, our <u>N Rate Risk Protection Program</u> is enrolling until <u>April 30.</u>


