

# High Tunnel Builð at Prairie Sky Farm

#### LOCATION

**Prairie Sky Farm** 2505 22th Ave. Wesley, IA 50483

## **DESCRIPTION:**

During this two-day, hands-on workshop, attendees will learn all the steps to building a high tunnel. Adam Montri, the hoophouse outreach specialist with Michigan State University, will lead the workshop, answering questions about construction, design and production along the way. The workshop will start with post-pounding and finish with a 72-by-30-foot Four Seasons Tools high tunnel ready for use at Prairie Sky Farm. If you are interested in building a high tunnel on your farm, this is a must-attend event.

**FOOD:** Light breakfast, snacks, and lunch will be provided both days of the workshop. Dinner will be provided Thursday evening during the High Tunnel Build "Drop-in" Field Day at Prairie Sky Farm (see the Practical Farmers Field Day Guide for more).
